

NULJ pricing

The National Union List of Journals (NULJ) is a membership subscription scheme. No charges are made for supplying articles to other libraries, but an annual membership fee is paid to UHL Libraries & Information Services (University Hospitals of Leicester NHS Trust) who run the scheme. This covers the administration of, and improvements to, the scheme.

We have changed pricing structure so that is no longer a flat fee per site, but rather it is based on the number of journal titles offered by each organisation. This is to encourage libraries to share more titles and, therefore, to make the scheme more and more useful to members.

The number of titles listed is calculated for the whole organisation, with the first site to join paying the full price for that number of journals, and then each additional site that joins from the same organisation being able to join for half price.

A minimum of 10 titles need to be offered by member organisations

Number of journal titles listed	First site	Additional sites
10-49	£100	£50
50-100	£80	£40
101 or more	£50	£25
Organisation with most titles	Free	Free

Example

An organisation has 3 site libraries. They decide to list 72 titles on NULJ. The first site will pay £80 per year with the other two sites paying £40 each. The 72 titles can be spread across all three sites – so ‘Site A’ could list 40 titles, ‘Site B’ 23 and ‘Site C’ just 9 titles.
